1. What to do with uneaten food left over on people's plates?

- ____ Dig a hole and bury it.

3. What to do with paper and cardboard food wrappers?

Choose one:

- ____ Discard them into the black trash bag.
- ____ Toss them into the fire pit for burning later.

- 4. What to do with plastic? For example, empty water bottles, foam plates, foam cups, eating utensils, cellophane wrappers, packing inserts, etc.
- Choose one:
 - ____ Discard them into the black trash bag.
 - ____ Toss them into the fire pit for burning later.

When we fling the dirty water into the woods, the food scraps will simply go with them.


We ought to figure out some way to strain the food scraps out of the water before the water gets tossed.
