**Second Class Requirement 6b4**  
**"Tell what to do for 'hurry cases' of ... ingested poisoning."**  
**(Handbook page 168)**

1. This requirement is about "ingested" poisoning -- not poison ivy etc. on the skin. What do they mean by "ingested"?
  - \_\_\_ Poison that the victim swallowed
  - \_\_\_ Poison that the victim breathed in, such as carbon monoxide
  - \_\_\_ Both the above
  
2. Among young children, poisoning is the most frequent cause of accidental death, since they might swallow anything. In a smart household, potential poisons are all stored in a safe place. Which of these seem like good candidates for safe storage or disposal?  
*(OK to choose more than one)*
  - \_\_\_ fuels
  - \_\_\_ battery acid
  - \_\_\_ peeling wall paint
  - \_\_\_ pills from a medicine cabinet
  - \_\_\_ cosmetics
  - \_\_\_ pesticides
  - \_\_\_ cleaning products
  - \_\_\_ household chemicals such as bleach
  - \_\_\_ household poisons such as rat poison
  - \_\_\_ spinach or broccoli
  
3. Symptoms to look for when a victim has ingested some poison:

  - \_\_\_ vomit on the floor
  - \_\_\_ burns around the mouth
  - \_\_\_ abnormal breathing
  - \_\_\_ spilled liquid on the floor
  - \_\_\_ a medicine bottle lying around
  - \_\_\_ spinach or broccoli on the dinner plate

**Why should I call the poison center?**

Poison experts are at the poison center 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. Their help is free and confidential. Calling the poison center is faster and cheaper than calling an ambulance and going to the emergency room, and many poison exposures can be treated at home.
